



Our History

ADVANCES IN ANESTHESIA



Until 1969, Anesthesiology was a section of the Department of Surgery. In 1928, Dr. Livingstone was appointed the first Professor and Chairperson of Anesthesia at the University of Chicago. She served in this capacity until 1952. She was both an outstanding clinician and leading investigator in the advancement of general, spinal and local anesthesia and in the study of bronchial injury and repair.

DR. LIVINGSTONE'S MILESTONES

» She established the first recovery room here at the University of Chicago.
» In 1933, anesthesiology at the hospital became one of the first all physician sections in the U.S., which was very unusual at the time.

» In 1940, she was one of only four female chairs of anesthesiology in the country and one of three women who headed residency programs in the field.







- Paired 1:1 with attending in the OR for 1 month
- Afternoon lectures with lunch
- Early exit times to facilitate studying

- Further solidifying advanced clinical skills
- Lectures and rotations to determine future career choices
- Practice Oral Boards and Theory & Practice

Can apply for 1-6 months of research elective time



- 2 > 3 fellows/year supervisory role




Critical Care

• CTICU

- VADs
- Post-op heart, lung transplants
- ECMO
- Complex vascular
- Thoracic
- SICU:
 - Post-surgery, burns, trauma
 - High volume with trauma center
 - Collaborative ICU with transplant, trauma, and anesthesia
- 3 fellows/year

Obstetrics



- Catch-all hospital on the South Side
- 3000 deliveries/year & rising
- 30% C-sections
- Majority are "high-risk"
- Level 3 NICU
- 1 fellow/year

- Residents do bread and butter peds to high acuity cases
- Level 1 Pediatric Trauma Center
- Majority of cases are PICU and complex neonates from NICU
- 1 fellow/year



 - Highly **interventional** clinic
 - 4800 procedures/year
 - **Residents** do procedures
- 2 weeks of Acute Pain Service


- 2 locations: Evanston & Skokie

Schedule & Hours

- GOR: 49-58 hrs/wk
- ICU 57-63 hrs/wk
- OB 58-65 hrs/wk
- Cardiac 47-57 hrs/wk
- Peds 41-53 hrs/wk
- Pain 40-51 hrs/wk

Night Call Schedules



OR Night Float

- Mon-Thursday (Weekend off)
- Fri-Sunday (Post-call Monday)

Weekends

• Sat/Sunday: Day call

Weekdays

 Day Call – 3 late positions to help transition ORs to night team

Non-call residents do not relieve CRNAs

- OB: days/nights
- Peds/cardiac: home call
- ICU: varies, 24h call vs days/nights



- Theory & Practice (CA2)




